THE EXPERIENCE

Visitors of the Toronto Holocaust Museum will have the unique opportunity to immerse themselves in the lives of Canadian survivors, following their journeys from prewar, their experiences during the Holocaust to their eventual immigration and life in Canada. Designed for the post-survivor era, the Museum stands to be the most technologically advanced in the region, integrating augmented reality and interactive inquiry-based approaches to ensure survivor testimony will continue to be shared long after they are gone.

WHY NOW?

With antisemitism on the rise, the Toronto Holocaust Museum is critical infrastructure in our society needed to help confront and counter hate. As we enter the post-survivor era, the Museum will become a permanent link to our past, playing a fundamental role in understanding and confronting violent histories and preventing future atrocities.

HIGHLIGHTS

- The new space will be 9,511 sq. ft., nearly twice as large as the former Holocaust Education Centre space.
- THM will contain a 40-seat theatre showcasing both archival and new, specially curated footage and films.
- Visitors will have an opportunity to experience four themed galleries plus a learning lab for dialogue, discussion, and workshops.
- The exhibition includes more than 220 minutes of survivor testimony in theme-based clips, across 11 testimony stations, showcasing more than 70 Holocaust survivors' experiences.
